

1. The Club shall be called the Roding Rifle and Pistol Club with its H.Q. at 50, Loughton Way, Buckhurst Hill, Essex, IG9 6AD.

The Officers of the Club shall be known as 'The Committee' and shall be the General Secretary, Treasurer, and other offices

The Annual Subscriptions shall be payable, in advance on the 1st January each year.

The Committee may make Bye-Laws & Regulations in regard to the running of the Club.

The Committee may remove from the Roll of Members, any Member whose conduct on the range or upon premises occupied by the club (or elsewhere) is unsafe.

If a Member, who renews their Firearm Certificate through the Club, does not use the Club range regularly over a period of 6 months, without good reason, then the Secretary will inform the Police that He/She is not an active member of the Club.

Application for membership must be made to the secretary on the prescribed form and admission as a full Member will be considered by the Committee after the applicant has served a probationary period of 6 months.

All members will be required to shot once per month or 12 times a year

- A) There will be no Day Membership**
- B) There will be no Temporary Membership.**

Absolutely no High Velocity, Supersonic or Big Bang ammunition is to be used at any time in any indoor range, neither may you use hollow-point bullets.

Beginners who, on joining, have never had any previous experience of shooting will be instructed in the applicable discipline by any qualified Member

Before being permitted to shoot, beginners shall be taught how to take correct sight and aim at a stationary target, and have the various parts of the rifle or pistol explained to them. They shall also be instructed in range etiquette, Range Officer commands and how to deal with a mis-fire.

A Range Officer (who must also be a Full Member) must be present at all times when shooting is in progress. They will be in sole charge and responsible for the observance of the regulations for the conduct of shooting.

No one shall be allowed in front of the firing point without permission from the Range Officer. Everyone doing so should also check each and every rifle and/or pistol on the firing point to make sure it has a breech flag in place

No Member may load His/Her rifle or pistol until he/she has taken up his/her position on the firing point and been given the "Clear to Shoot" or "Carry on" command from the Range Officer

The command "Stop-Stop-Stop" all rifles must be immediately made safe and put down with breach flags in place.

Members must not point a rifle or pistol, either loaded or un-loaded at any person or in any direction other than towards the target or butts from the firing point being used.
